Roadmap Indicator Updates

❖ Updates

- Added FFY 2013 and FFY 2014 data from the CMS-416 reports, reporting on Eligibles Enrolled at Least 90 Days
- Updated ED trend data through 2013
- Added age group breakouts to CMS-416 Data
- Added two “oral health” services indicators from CMS-416 Data:
 - Percentage of Medicaid/CHIP Eligible Children Enrolled at Least 90 Days Receiving **Oral Health Services provided by a Non-Dentist Provider**
 - Percentage of Medicaid/CHIP Eligible Children Enrolled at Least 90 Days Receiving **Any Dental or Oral Health Service**

Roadmap Indicator Updates

❖ General Findings:

- Although Florida remains below the national average, the percentage of Medicaid-enrolled children in Florida receiving dental services has been increasing over time.
- Children in the oldest and youngest age cohorts have the lowest dental utilization rates.
- Receipt of oral health services provided by non-dental providers is highest among children 1-2 years old.
- Emergency department data indicate an increasing trend in dental-related visits and associated charges between 2005-2013.
