## PhD in Public Health

**One Health Concentration** The PhD in Public Health with a concentration One Health is a research-oriented health degree that emphasizes working across public health, veterinary health, and environmental health disciplines to tackle difficult health problems. The PhD program focuses on global health and infectious diseases while emphasizing research and elements of grant writing and funding. This is the first known One Health PhD program in the world.



## **Certificate in One Health**

The Certificate in One Health is designed to introduce the graduate student to the principals of One Health. The primary purpose of this Certificate is to provide One Health training to public health, veterinary health, and environmental health professionals and students who wish to follow such careers. Training includes lectures, tutorials, field experiences, laboratory exercises, public health demonstrations, and written exams.
